2017 marked the 4<sup>th</sup> year of the Geary County Fetal Infant Mortality Review (FIMR) project funded by Kansas Health Foundation and the United Methodist Ministry Funds. ***This year, the FIMR Case Review Team (CRT) methodically analyzed 100% of abstracted cases of fetal and infant loss and made 7 recommendations for action at 4 CRT meetings. The Community Action Team (CAT) met 4 times to translate those CRT recommendations into relevant community action strategies.***

Partnerships and collaboration is the hallmark of Geary County FIMR. ***This year, our team members donated more than \$2000 in time and professional services.
